Message from the Principal

A really important couple of weeks for Year 11; Parents' Evening, Mocks and Open Evenings

The last three weeks have been incredibly successful for the school. The Open Evening on 3rd October saw over 500 people in attendance; the feedback sheets have been incredibly positive with a real sense of the community recognising the significant steps being made by the school to re-brand and re-new. It was very pleasing to get a sense of the support blossoming for the school. My thanks go especially to all the pupils who gave up their time to show all the parents around and who were a credit to the school.

The uniform consultation has had a marked response from pupils and parents. We are currently processing nearly a thousand response forms and we will announce after half-term the outcomes of this process.

As we conclude the first half term we begin to move into the most important phase for Year 11. It is essential that parents of Year 11 support their children to engage not only with homework, but also with wider working practises including intervention. Revision using notes, guides and websites will be key to the forthcoming mock examinations which start on Monday 7th November and last for a fortnight. In addition to this I launched the start of the next phase for Year 11 last Friday—Sixth Form Open Evening Season is upon us! My "Information, Advice and Guidance" assembly encourages Year 11 to look carefully now at their choices after leaving Year 11, they need to consider what A Levels, BTECs or Apprenticeships they are interested in and ensure they start to visit the institutions of their choice—the dates for these can be seen above. It is essential that those pupils wishing to go to University visit the www.ucas.com website and investigate what qualifications are required for the degrees of their choice. A wrong selection now, may close future doors. Each child in Year 11 will get a one to one interview with a member of the Senior Leader team straight after half-term to help with this important process.




READ-A-THON

Supporting children through key adults

Operation Encompass was created so that by 9.00am on the next school day, a 'Key Adult" will be informed that the child or young person has been involved in or witnessed a domestic incident. This knowledge, given to schools through Operation Encompass, allows the provision of immediate early intervention through 'overt' or 'silent support', depending upon the needs and wishes of the child. We believe that this kind of early intervention is every child's right

Sporting News


