Message from the Principal "Admissions figures show a 12% uplift on last year"

This week we received notification that we have 141 children assigned to the school for September from 24 York primary schools. This is fantastic news as it represents a 12% uplift in numbers from last year and means that the school will be able to grow into a five form intake next year. This is a real green shoot of recommendation from the local community and I want to thank all parents with children here for making sure the word out in the community is one of rapid change, improving standards, positivity and significant improvements. 2017 is looking already set to be a record year. Very shortly your child will start to talk about PD positive discipline behaviour new our management system. This will be introduced after Easter, and includes a new planner and new codes that will make it far easier for you to identify areas in which your child is under-performing or causing concern. PD also ties in with a new rewards system that we have been trialling. Further details are included in this Newsletter of our next rewards trip co-ordinated by Mr Orr. I was very proud to hear that over 350 students have the equivalent of less than one basic expectation stamp a week and nearly 100 pupils (20%) have none at all – very well done to those students, thank you for giving your very best always.

We are also pleased to announce that we are offering the European Computer Driving Licence to all our year 11's. This is a qualification for ICT skills and digital literacy which is equivalent to a GCSE qualification. This will not only give our students an extra award but will give them an edge when competing for jobs and courses in the future.

Year 10 are working hard on their GCSE courses; homework is improving and they are showing progress in all aspects of their studies. Presentation, and pride in their work is a focus and we are seeing some improvement from some students in this area. Nearly all students are

now planned and prepared for their Work Experience in May.

SPORTING UPDATE: SILVERWARE FOR THE U15 BASKETBALLERS



After an excellent second season where the under 15 basketball squad has not only grown in size but also in stature and status across the York and District, they qualified for the shield final. The final is played on a round robin basis with games played to a shortened format so concentration and execution must be high as any slip in standards can lead to a game being over before you've got started. The first game saw us play our Trust rivals Manor CE. The key to this game was the quality of our bench; Manor had a squad of

only 6 players and in a tight first half, our interchanges had real impact bringing an extra level of pace to the game. Mid way through the second half, for the first time we opened up a small lead and despite a strong comeback from Manor, Vale of York played out a 4 point win. Job half done.
