GCSE Music

At KS4 we run the AQA GCSE Music course. The course provides an opportunity to develop and apply musical knowledge and skills through a wide variety of genres with an emphasis on practical music-making. The subject content is divided into three components: Understanding Music (40%), Performing Music (30%) and Composing Music (30%).

From there they may wish to access a plethora of degree courses relating to everything from classical music to jazz, pop, folk, studio engineering and electronic music. Instrumental Tuition

York Music Service is the primary provider of tuition at Vale of York offering instrumental and vocal lessons for all ages and abilities on a wide range of instruments including voice. Lessons take place during the school day on a rotation and can be differing lengths dependant on need. Financial assistance may be offered in certain circumstances.

All students continuing music at GCSE level are advised to seek instrumental or vocal tuition to assist with the 30% performance coursework.
