Message from the Progress Leader team

Bike safety – there have in recent weeks, been issues raised about how students are riding their bikes to and from school given the darker mornings and evenings. Attendance – Whilst attendance has been steadily improving, it has not been as strong as it could be. VOYAGE – Vale of York Able and Gifted Enrichment



We were delighted to launch our brand new programme for Gifted and Talented Primary school pupils in our catchment called VOYAGE. Aimed at high performing Year 5's, Vale Of York Academy Gifted Enrichment consists of six 90 minute sessions leading up to the Summer. In these sessions, the pupils are given very challenging problems to solve in the fields of Science and Computer Science. Based on their performance, they will be accredited a pass, merit or distinction for each session, leading towards a graduation event in the Summer. The students from Clifton with Rawcliffe, Clifton Green, Burton Green and Lakeside made an outstanding start, with pupils, parents and staff alike giving great feedback about the scheme.



We have been really pleased with the work produced by the year 11's in their mock exam. Students had an 'Under the Sea' theme and had to link their work to observational studies, combined with the stylisation of the artist Dave White. Students had 5 hours to produce their piece of work from scratch and the results show a high level of skill, focus and creativity. We cannot wait to see what they do for their final exam!



Year 8 have recently completed giant work for their Pop Art Project. Their homework 'Little made Big' asked students to take a small household object and to imagine it larger than life and then to make it in 3D. We are sure you'll agree that the effort that has gone into this is very impressive and clearly a lot of parents have got involved too which is great to see. This work links to the pop artist Claus Oldenburg whose giant sculptures can be found in most cities around the world and shows that the smallest thing can have great impact.
