Students from year 7 and year 8 experienced a range of different subjects, such as psychology, philosophy, history of art, robotics, maths and science. This offered them the chance to participate in some interesting activities: dissecting a sheep's heart; learning how cans can crush themselves; and discovering which planets can support life.

Year 9 and year 10 masterclasses focused on one subject. Some students from Vale of York Academy chose to specialise in classics, learning about gods and heroes. Others opted to develop their art skills, creating huge sculptures of heads. Vale of York Academy teachers were also involved, as Mr Wilson, Mr Padgham, and Mr Norwood led masterclasses.
