Dear Parents/Carers and Students

Firstly and most importantly, I hope this letter finds you and your family well as we begin a summer term the like of which we have never experienced before. These are unprecedented times and I wanted to provide you with an update on what is happening within the education sector and how the Hope Learning Trust are responding to the ongoing Covid 19 crisis. We are in unchartered territory and don't yet know when the students will return to school or the conditions under which they can return. So, in the meantime, we are doing everything within our power to support our students during this difficult time.

As you will be aware, our school is providing emergency care to the children of key workers and vulnerable families within our communities. We have established a rota system so that staffing is in place for these children with everyone else working on producing online learning materials for the vast majority of students who are learning from home. I encourage all students to continue to access these excellent resources and to make the most of this time. Please refer to our school website/Google classroom to access these learning materials.

The Government has not given an indication of when schools are likely to reopen and I wanted to reassure you that we will only reopen when the Government's expert medical advice says it is safe to do so. We will follow national guidelines for the safety of our students, staff and the wider community. Furthermore, conversations are ongoing at Local Authority level to ensure that there is a joined-up approach to reopening. School leaders are discussing the different practical procedures which will be needed to reopen primary, secondary and special schools, as each setting will present its own challenges.

Please be assured that we are working hard to prioritise the following key initiatives:

- · collecting assessment data for GCSEs and vocational courses;
- · continuing to monitor and support our most vulnerable families;
- making contact with all families to check how students are and see if they can support them to access the online learning resources;
- · continuing to develop new curriculum material for students' online work;
- providing IT equipment for vulnerable learners (once the Government has issued directives);
- continuing to support families to receive their vouchers for food in lieu of Free School Meals;
- planning for the reopening phase.









To be absolutely clear, Hope Learning Trust is committed to ensuring that our students and staff return to work in our schools as soon as possible but only when the Government's expert medical advice says it is safe for schools to do so.

Finally, I wanted to thank you for your continued support and the positive feedback we have received in support of our staff. At this time, the most important thing is to safeguard everyone's health and well-being so please continue to follow the Government's guidance.

I look forward to a time when our school is filled with students again.
