CURRICULUM INTENT

Why is it important that pupils at Vale of York study Business?

Studying Business at Vale of York Academy will give students a clear insight on how the working, professional world functions. Business is a subject that lends itself to students learning a wide range of important transferable skills. From the different topics covered, to the language that students will use, it is a tool to enable learners a head start into engaging with a future career post GCSE. Pupils will become skilled in making decisions, being creative, solving problems, understanding finance, analysing data and working as part of a team. They will not only gain business knowledge and understanding, but will gain the opportunity to put it into practice through a range of business activities and projects.

Whether you plan to work in a large multinational (like Nestle or Norwich Union), set up on your own or somewhere inbetween GCSE Business Studies is a great introduction to understanding the different roles and functions of a business.

CURRICULUM STATEMENT

At KS4: In AQA GCSE Business Studies, students will consider the practical application of business concepts through the learning of 6 units: Business in the real world; Influences on business; Business operations; Human Resources; Marketing; and Finance.

The AQA curriculum transitions well into those students wanting to continue the subject at KS5. The six units provide opportunities to explore theories and concepts in the most relevant way, through the context of events in the business and economic world.

CURRICULUM OPPORTUNITIES

Within the formal curriculum	In Year 10, students have the opportunity to visit a real life business to understand the daily workings of a professional arena. In Year 11, students have the opportunity, and are invited to partake in a video call, or in person, question and answer session with school alumni or budding business entrepreneurs. Year 11 students also have the chance to partake in selected online revision webinars in the summer term in preparation for their Business GCSE.	
Links to other curriculum areas	Our main curriculum links at KS4 are with Maths and English. Maths - Throughout the GCSE course, Maths is prevalent to students ' learning. From learning about business calculations/formulas when creating business plans to studying Business Finance in Year 11, the link to maths understanding is vital to partaking in the subject. English - When studying the whole course, the reading and interpretation of real life case studies is key to students progression. Furthermore, due to the nature of the two Business exam papers it is crucial that students can compile, develop and structure longer written answers for the questions they are given.	
Preparation for adult life	Regular revision and the creation of revision folders encourages students to become independent learners which is crucial for post-16 education, training and employment. Topics enable students to reflect on morals, values & actions of individuals/societies, encouraging them to become valuable members of their own community as adults. The skills taught in KS4 prepare students for A Level Business. Business skills, naturally, can be transferred to a wide range of careers and situations in adult life. With the nature of the course it is inevitable that students will gain valuable abilities that will serve them well in whatever careers they go on to partake in.	



CURRICULUM IMPLEMENTATION

As an Academy we have a range of clear standards and expectations of our pupils however each subject area has its own individual practices and habits that ensure that it can function to its optimum.

Curriculum delivery:

In Business, students learn in a variety of different ways. A large amount of work is completed both online using a computer, and in individual exercise books. Students build up their skills of learning throughout their time at Vale of York Academy.
