Why is it important that pupils at Vale of York study Health and Social Care?

Health and Social will benefit students who are interested in the Health and Social care profession. CURRICULUM IMPLEMENTATION

Curriculum delivery:

Cambridge National Health and Social Care is only taught in KS4. It allows students to gain an understanding of working in a Health, Social or Early Years profession. All KS4 subjects are assessed through portfolio work and exam testing.
